a group from Great Haven Assembly joined us on Muskowekwan

Psalm 30:2 (ESV) O LORD my God, I cried to you for help, and you have healed me.

The National Day for Truth and Reconciliation is on Sep 30th. On Friday Oct 3rd the new plaque will be unveiled at the residential school on Muskowekwan. We are very blessed to be able to share the Good News of Jesus Christ to the special people of Muskowekwan twice a month at the band hall. We have been able to develop relationships with many people on the reserve and are continuing to grow as a part of the community.

In what manner can we continue to foster reconciliation?

We can do so by continuing to show the love of Jesus Christ to Indigenous people on Muskowekwan and also here in North Central Regina and by continuing to help people find healing and salvation through Jesus Christ. One of the great challenges is how to break the cycle of generational brokenness. It has been a struggle to see children set free from destructive patterns that begin to rise to the surface as they enter teen years even after being taught the truth of the Gospel. This can be addressed by helping them to understand who they are in Christ as well as long term relationships with the children and showing them what it looks like to follow Jesus.



Associate Pastor Omar

We're very excited to have hired a new part-time associate pastor who has extensive ministry experience working with children and teens in poverty. Omar White started at the Good News Chapel in July. God led him to start a soccer ministry for youth in a similar neighborhood in Jamaica. He was able to walk alongside many youth from Olympic Gardens- one of the rougher inner-city communities in Kingston, Jamaica. Many of these youth could have easily slipped into a life of crime and violence, but Omar has seen how God can use the game of soccer to point them in a more positive and purposeful direction. One story is about a teen boy who grew up in poverty in a single parent home. He came out to soccer and, little by little, grew in skill due to his love for the game and more importantly he began to open up to the devotionals and encouragement from the scriptures. Eventually, he made the decision to give his life to Jesus Christ and that's been the real victory! Life hasn't always been easy for him but he's worked hard to keep his relationship with God strong. He shows up at church, connects with other young people, and even messages Omar now and then here in Canada for encouragement. Watching his determination- on the field, in his walk with God, and even as he builds his career (in welding and metalwork) has been a great joy to Omar!

It is Omar's hope to build a ministry in North Central Regina like what he started in Jamaica. His goal is to give youth hope, to show them Christ's love, and to help them see there's a different path they can take. Reconciliation happens when we begin to see the next generation transformed by the power of Jesus Christ. To God be the glory, great things He has done, and continues to do!
